43. A Plaited Loaf – made with 450g of flour
44. 6 Cheese Straws

47. Set Recipe :-

Blueberry Seed Cake

Ingredients

6oz soft butter or margarine
6oz light muscavado sugar
6oz SR flour, sifted with
1 tsp baking pdr
2 medium eggs, beaten
Rind and juice small orange
1/2 oz poppy seeds
8oz fresh blueberries

Method

- Turn oven to 180C, prepare 8 inch round tin
- Beat together butter, sugar, flour, baking pdr, and eggs for 1-2 minutes. Stir in seeds, rind and juice.
- Put mixture in tin and scatter berries on top.
- Bake 50 to 60 mins, until bouncy in centre of cake, when pressed gently with finger.
- Cool in tin for 5 mins.

N.B. No picture frames or mounts allowed (class 53 excepted). Exhibits previously entered in Knaresborough Horticultural Society shows will not be allowed.

50. A vase made of recycled materials, containing max. 5 handmade paper flowers
51. A knitted/crocheted/sewn peg bag.

52. A handmade Christmas Decoration
53. 3 postcard size photographs Sun, Sea & Sand, informally mounted on 1 x A4 sheet of card
54. A Painting of fruit – any medium – unframed – up to A4 size

Children's Open Classes – up to 7 Years Old or 8 to 15 Years Old

No Entry Fee for Classes 55-58, but entry forms must be completed for each exhibitor, with the age of the entrant clearly marked.

55. A decorated gingerbread family, at least 3 people
56. A Drawing of an insect
57. A Photograph of any item from an unusual angle to make a mystery photo for visitors to identify – postcard size (answer in a sealed envelope)
58. Produce a seedling of fruit or veg from a pip or a seed in a pot no larger than 155mm/6"

Competition Rules

1. Telephone Entries will be accepted, but completed entry forms, together with entry fees must be handed to the Secretary before staging the exhibits.
2. The exhibitor must have grown all exhibits for at least 8 weeks prior to the Show, other than Classes 38-57.

3. Objections to an exhibitor or exhibit must be made in writing to the Secretary, not later than 4.30 pm on the first day of the Show. The Secretary reserves the right to inspect any exhibitor's garden in order to determine if an objection is justified.
4. Whenever possible, all exhibits must be named by the exhibitor.
5. The decisions of the judges as to the relative merits of the exhibits staged are final. Prizes may be withheld at the judges' discretion, if an exhibit is considered undeserving of the prize offered.
6. Exhibits and prize cards must not be removed before the time stated in the schedule. Any exhibitor breaking this rule will forfeit any prize money due.
7. The Committee will take every precaution against damage to exhibits staged, but cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss which may occur.
8. The Show Committee is authorised to settle any dispute that may occur, for any matter not specifically covered by these rules.
9. All trophies remain the property of the Society. Holders are required to sign to acknowledge receipt and to keep them in safe custody for 12 months until they are returned to the Society.
10. Exhibitors are requested to clear their exhibits and prize cards at the close of the Show and to clear pots, paper, vases etc. The Society would be pleased to receive any donation of unwanted exhibits that will be sold in the auction of produce at the close of the Show.
11. Handicrafts Classes: Exhibitors will only be allowed to enter an exhibit once, i.e. the same exhibit cannot be entered in competitive classes year on year.

Knarborough Horticultural Society meets at 7.15 pm every 3rd Wednesday of the month from September to April. During the summer, visits are arranged to gardens of interest. There are mini competitions most months.
